Additional study of augmented sixth chords, altered dominants, Neapolitan sixth chord, diminished seventh chords, chromatic mediants, foreign key modulation and 9th, 11th and 13th chords. Advances exercises in original composition and in analysis. Three hours each week. *Prerequisites:* 123/124. Taken concurrently with 222. 2 credits.

Course Learning Objectives:

- 1) Explore the media, genre, craft and presentation of the art of music
- 2) Practice the technical processes of art through the recognition and idiomatic use of chromatic chords and formal units when:
 - a) Analyzing standard repertoire
 - b) Composing voice-leading exercises and simple model projects in 18th- and 19th-century styles
 - c) Dealing with extensions of tonal harmony that modulate to closely and distantly related keys while utilizing larger forms and formal units
- 3) Increase each student's ability to understand:
 - a) The historical context of what s/he sees in musical scores and hears as musical compositions
 - b) The enjoyment of educated performance, active listening, and communication about music
 - c) And recognize the forms of music
