Catalogue Description:

Continuation studies begun in 222 with some emphasis on 20th century musical styles. Taken concurrently with 223. Two hours each week. 1 credit.

Course Learning Objectives:

- 1. Develop your musicianship skills so you can hear and understand music readily even within the contemporary landscape
- 2. Recognition of the tonic within a changing, and ever-more ambiguous, harmonic landscape
- 3. Differentiate between scale degrees and how their function changes within a complex harmonic framework
- 4. Develop sight reading and writing skills using the traditional movable "do" solfège system
- 5. Identification of musical structures
- 6. Basic improvisation
- 7. Learn the feel of compound and changing metrical structures
- 8. Be able to sing and identify chromatic chords in any inversion or ordering
- 9. Develop an awareness of the function of chromatic chords and how they tend to resolve
